Spiny dogfish are small, slender, schooling sharks characterized by

SPINES ON THEIR DORSAL FINS

Spiny dogfish have a row of

SMALL WHITE SPOTS

that run along each side of the body. These spots fade with growth and even disappear entirely on some individuals.

SPINY DOGFISH/SPUR DOG (Squalus acanthias)

- Spiny dogfish are found around the world in coastal, relatively cool waters
- They got their common name because fishermen commonly noted that they hunt shoals of smaller fish in large dog-like "packs"
- > Spiny dogfish pregnancies are among the longest in the Animal Kingdom. Females carry about six pups for nearly two years (about as long as African elephants)!

HOW BIG?

Females give birth to live young, with each newborn pup ranging in size from 8-13 inches (20-33 cm) in length. The average size of adult spiny dogfish is 35-48 inches (90-120 cm)
